NOTE FROM FR. JOHN: Dear Parishioners: Having served as a hospital military chaplain on multiple tours at Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, I was trained, as were all hospital employees, military and civilian, in HIPPA regulations concerning matters of privacy and confidentiality regarding a patient's medical status. Several years ago the Archdiocese stopped providing any information to priests concerning colleagues who were hospitalized, on the basis that it was a potential violation of a priest's right to privacy. Even though a parish does not fall under the strict guidelines of HIPPA covered entities, the medical privacy of our parishioners and others is paramount. As a consequence, names on our sick list must have the individual's permission. In cases where an individual is extremely ill, or is a minor, permission may be given by an appropriate caregiver, guardian or family member. In the future, the names of the sick will now be relocated to our weekly bulletin, where they can be clearly and correctly noted. We will maintain an intention for all the sick in our Sunday prayer of the faithful, keeping in mind that Jesus directed much of his ministry to the pastoral care of the sick. Please inform us when you wish to have your name removed from the prayer list.
